# Warns Stalin of Ruin to Russia

## Message to Congress Tells of Strides That May Dwarf H-Bomb

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—President Truman today warned Soviet Premier Stalin to steer clear of war or destruction of the Russian homeland by awesome new atomic weapons perhaps even dwarfing the hydrogen bomb.

(For text of President Truman's "State of the Union" message see Page 10, Part I.)

"In the coming administration of President Eisenhower, Mr. Truman declared in coming to the White House, we have problems that with it be coupled the development of atomic energy.

"We have no reason to think that the stage we have now reached will be the last. We are being hurried forward in our mastery of the atom, from our discovery to another, toward yet unmeasurable peaks of destructive power.

The President's 10,000-word message, read aloud by clerks in both houses of Congress and broadcast by radio throughout the world, drew a rapt reception on Capitol Hill.

Sen. George D. Elms (D), professed it as a "timely warning to Stalin." Sen. Ellender (D), I. O., said he hoped it would be the time when we can serve an obligation on the Russians to tell the world who got the war in Korea or right.

Elms added, "I hope we can do that late this year." Sen. Taft (R) O. commented that the handling of foreign policy under Mr. Truman had been "as full of action" that the Eisenhower administration is.

## Bibles Move to Filibusters

### Senate Balks Effort to Change Rule Opening Way to Civil Rights Legislation

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—The Senate blocked off the filibuster issue, at least temporarily, today as the 83rd Congress got ready for the incoming Eisenhower administration and a new legislative program.

A motion to change the filibuster rule was defeated by a vote of 54 to 46. The motion was made by Sen. Charles McNary (R) Ore., who said the filibuster rule was "a relic of the past."

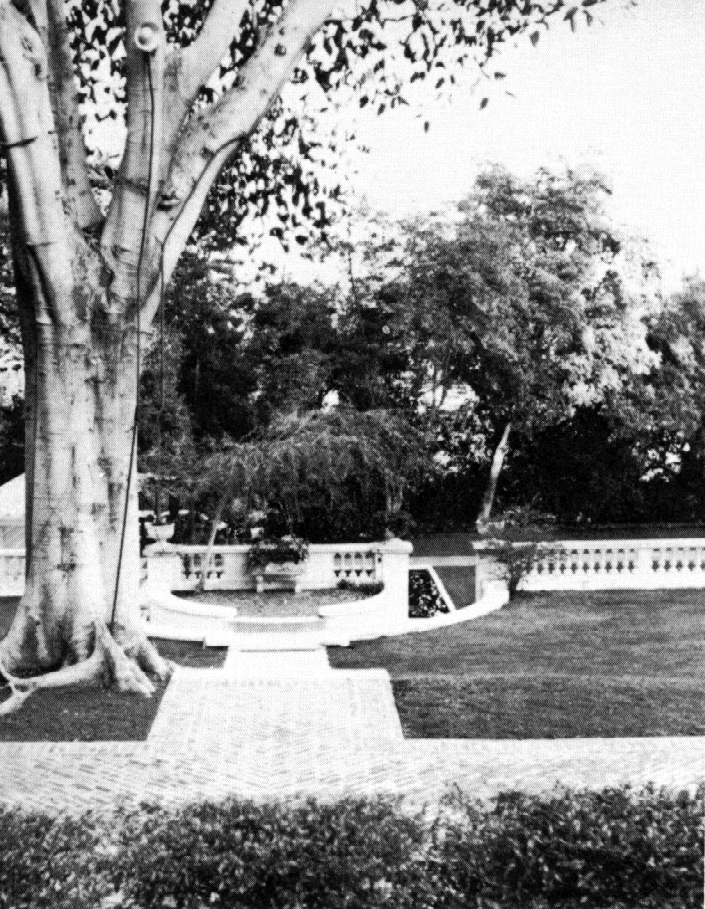

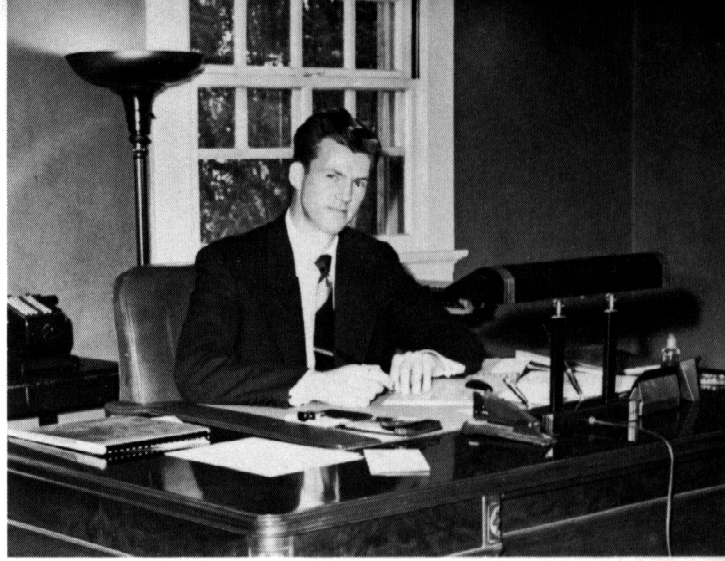

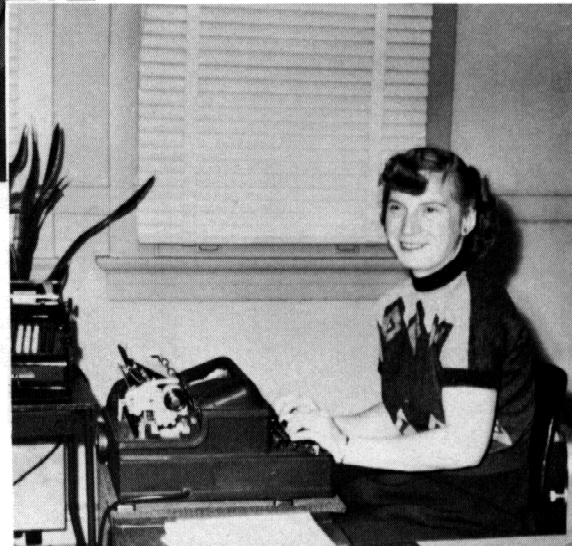

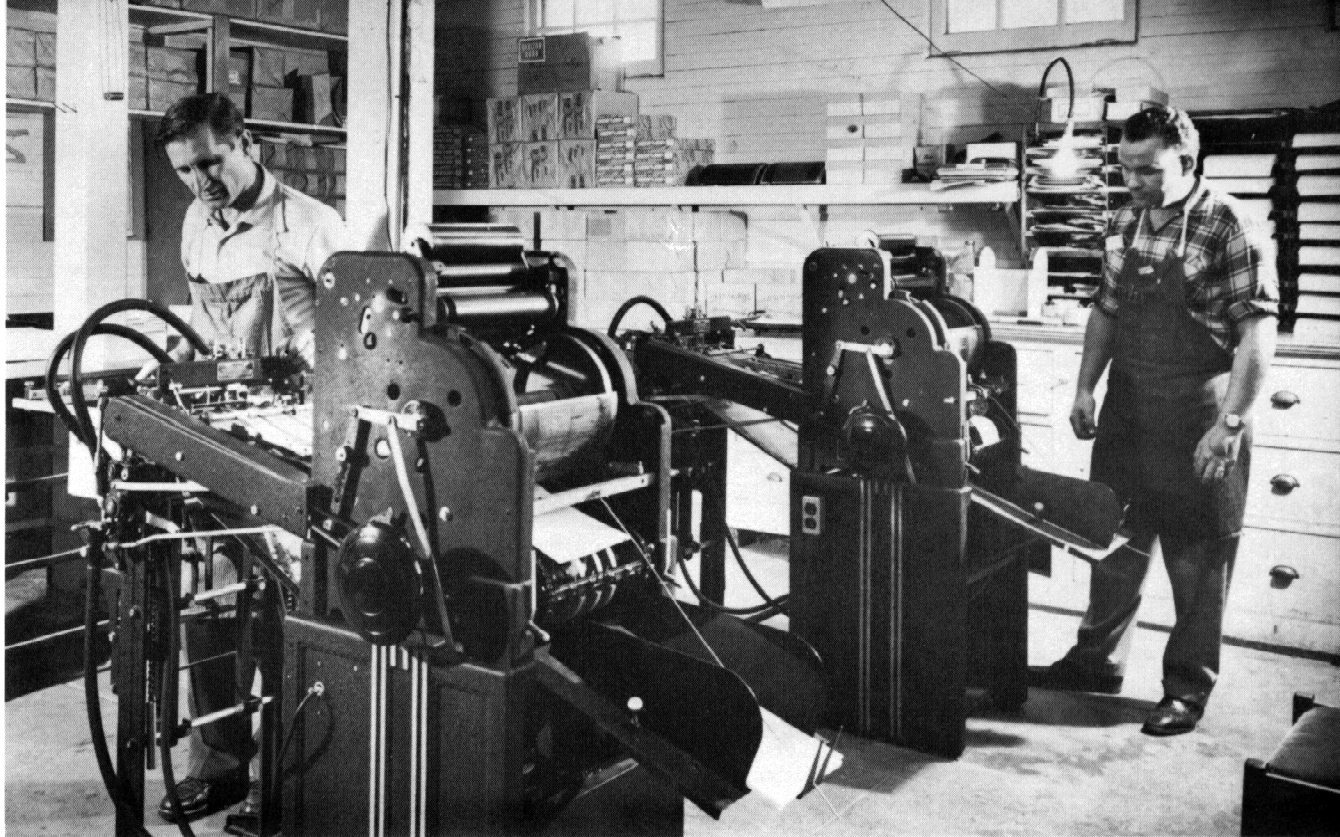

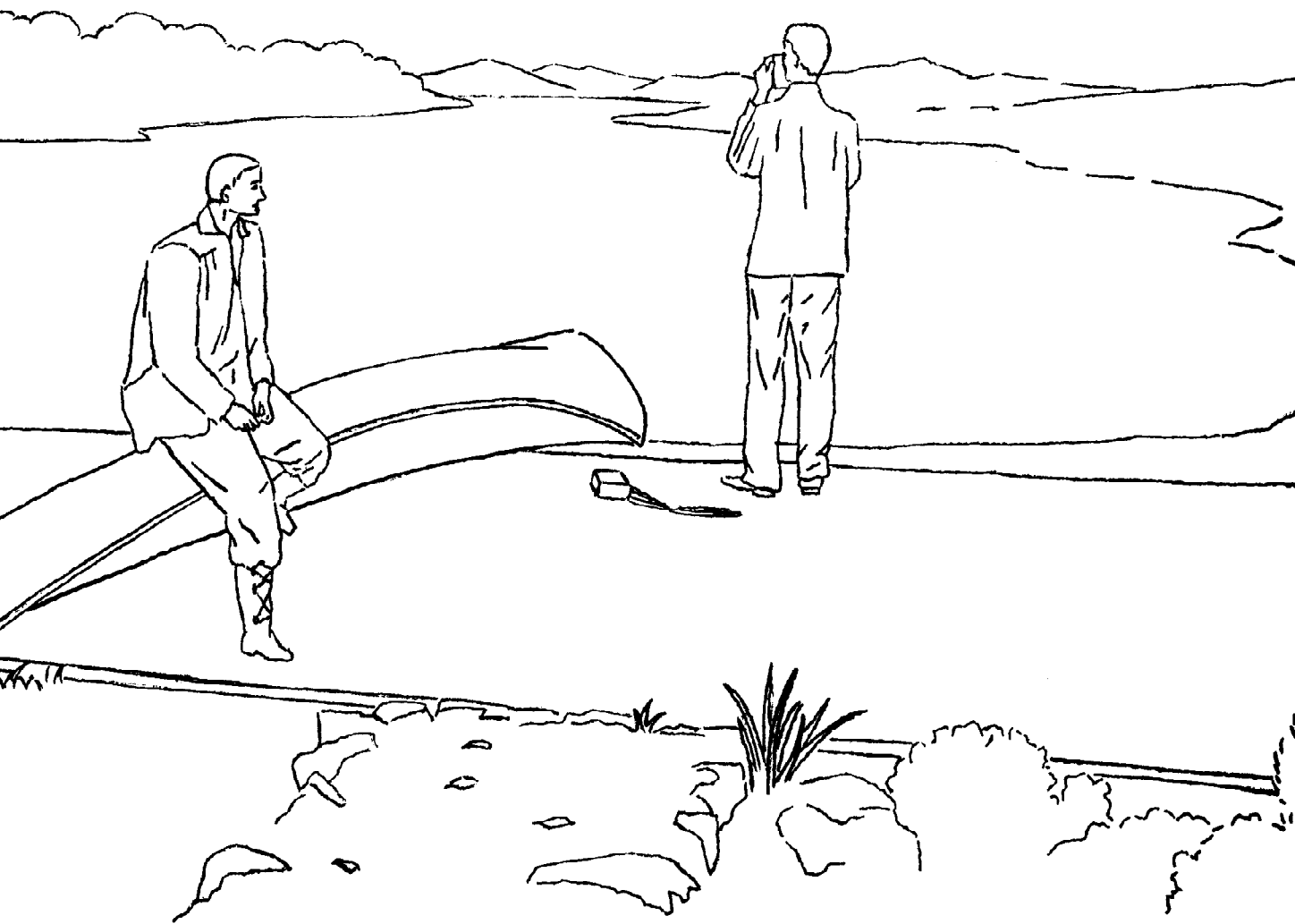

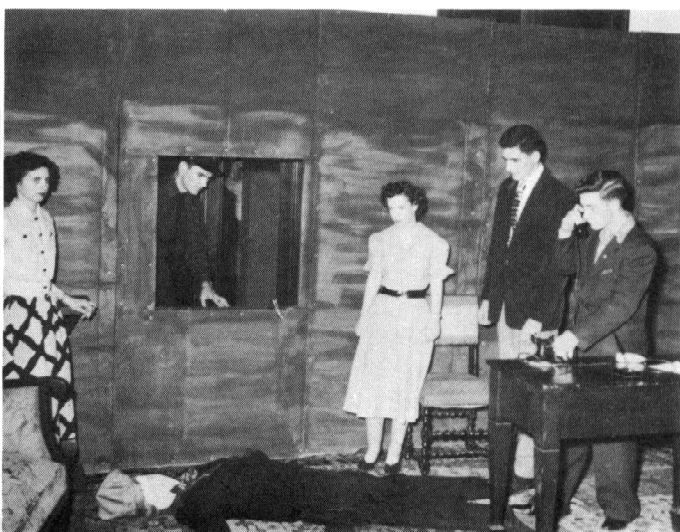
